



## Welcome to the Academic Enrichment Program Summer 2009

The University of Louisiana at Lafayette is pleased to announce plans for the Summer 2009 Academic Enrichment Program. In order to participate in this program, a student must qualify by testing at UL Lafayette or by presenting documentation of qualifying intelligence or achievement test scores from an approved outside source. Eligible students are accepted for the various program components and courses on a first-come, first-served basis. Schedules and fees for the Summer 2009 program are as follows:

Session II: July 6-16 (Monday-Thursday)  
Project Challenge: Not offered in 2009

**DAYS:** All classes meet Monday through Thursday,  
for 1 hour and 15 minutes per day, unless otherwise  
noted in the course description.

2-hour courses \$130\*  
Project Challenge Classes: \$25.00

### REFUND POLICY:

**Challenge Courses:** No refund unless class is full and vacancy  
can be filled.

**Regular Courses: June Session:** Through 5/22: Full refund of  
tuition paid\*; 5/25-5/29: Retain \$15 per course\*; 6/1-6/5: Retain  
\$25 per course\*. No refund after 6/8.

**July Session:** Through 6/19: Full refund of tuition paid\*;  
6/22-6/26: Retain \$15 per course\*; 6/29-7/2: Retain \$25 per  
course\*. No refund after 7/6.

**PLEASE NOTE: PARENTS WILL BE CHARGED FULL TUITION  
FOR CLASSES NOT DROPPED BEFORE CLASSES BEGIN.**

\*All refunds will be reduced by a processing fee of \$10 per student.  
Processing fee will not apply to courses canceled by our office. A  
student may change to another class without penalty no later than  
the morning of the second day of class.

**TRANSPORTATION TO CLASSES:** Parents are responsible for  
furnishing transportation to and from the campus and are  
encouraged to make at least one dry run between buildings and  
classrooms before allowing the children to travel alone. Although  
all but a few classes are located in Griffin or Fletcher Hall, the  
program staff cannot be responsible for supervising students  
between classes.

**CHILDREN BELOW THE FOURTH GRADE SHOULD NEVER BE  
ALLOWED TO TRAVEL TO OR FROM CLASSES WITHOUT  
PERSONAL SUPERVISION.**

**PARKING:** Card access is required to park between 7:00 AM and  
5:00 PM in the zones surrounding Maxim Doucet Hall, where the  
Center for Gifted Education is located, and H.L. Griffin Hall, where  
most summer classes are held. Visitors to our office are invited to  
use the parking lot behind the Student Union on McKinley Street.  
Parents bringing children to summer classes should park in  
designated areas (parking instructions will be provided to all  
registered families). A limited number of parking zone permits will  
be available for parents of young summer program students (K-3);  
details will be provided with schedule confirmations. Persons  
parking in restricted zones without a permit are subject to ticketing  
by University Police.

**REGISTRATION:** Online registration for Summer 2009 will begin  
at 8:00 AM on Saturday, April 25, and continue until midnight on  
Saturday, May 2. To gain access to the system, a family  
registration permit must be obtained for each summer. If you  
expect to register one or more children for Summer 2009, please  
follow the procedures outlined below.

1. Complete one **SUMMER 2009 FAMILY PRE-  
REGISTRATION FORM per family** (NOT one per  
student); **SEE LINK: Academic Enrichment Program  
Registration Form on website.**

Mail your Family Pre-Registration Form and the required deposit of \$65, which is the tuition for one class. **PLEASE DO NOT SEND CASH THROUGH THE MAIL, AND WE DO NOT ACCEPT CREDIT CARDS.**

3. On receipt of the **FAMILY PRE-REGISTRATION FORM** and deposit, we will send all materials needed for registration, including a Personal Access Code (PAC) number for each eligible child listed on your family form. Online registration will close at midnight on Saturday, May 2, after which registration will be handled in the office. All family forms should be returned immediately, as many classes fill rapidly once the online system opens.

**\*\* IMPORTANT: REGISTER FOR COURSES IN THE GRADE YOUR CHILD COMPLETED IN 2008-2009.**

**LATE REGISTRATION** (after online registration closes) will be processed individually in the office. If you wish to register (or to change a schedule) after May 2, call **(337-482-6701)** or e-mail us at **btrahan@louisiana.edu**, for instructions.

**Approximately two weeks after online registration closes**, you will receive a confirmed schedule for each participant in your family and a statement reflecting your tuition balance. **ALL FEES MUST BE PAID IN FULL AT LEAST TWO WEEKS BEFORE THE FIRST DAY OF CLASS. PARENTS WILL BE CHARGED FULL TUITION FOR CLASSES NOT DROPPED BEFORE CLASSES BEGIN.** Please note carefully our refund policies.

**INSURANCE:** UL Lafayette does not carry accident insurance on students attending the Academic Enrichment program. Student health insurance provides limited coverage for students participating in the residential programs.

**CLASSES AT VERMILIONVILLE:** We are again proud to announce courses offered by Vermilionville. The courses will run for 1¼ hour each day and will be located on the grounds of Vermilionville. Specialized craftspeople will bring the past to life as the students experience life as it was over two hundred years ago! The students will work hands-on in small, individualized groups and each day they will experience a different facet of life and discover what it was like when the Cajuns and Creoles first settled in Louisiana. This is sure to be an unforgettable two weeks. You don't want to miss this one!!

**CREATIVE EXPLORATION FOR PRESCHOOLERS:** This program offers a creative approach to school readiness, emphasizing reading and vocabulary enrichment through the use of both directed and spontaneous experiences. Hands-on activities using a variety of media, experiences in the natural and social sciences, and introduction to educational puzzles and games foster the development of advanced physical and reasoning skills. Two levels are offered, serving children who will enter kindergarten in Fall 2009 or 2010. Admission criteria differ from those of the other programs; preschool testing begins in October and has been completed for this year. To have a child tested for Summer 2010

or to obtain additional information, call 337-482-6701 in the fall preceding the year in which the child will be eligible for this program.

**KINDERGARTEN CLASSES:** Two options are available for children completing their kindergarten year: Kindergarten Kapers (Course #100) is similar in structure to our Pre-K classes (described above). This option offers a two-hour interdisciplinary class that emphasizes creativity, thinking skills, interpersonal communication, problem solving, and academic readiness. KK classes are held in Bourgeois Hall, off the main campus. Tuition for this two-week course is \$130; two sections are available for Summer 2009: June 8-18 (taught by Robin Picheloup), and July 6-16 (taught by Deirdre Robertson). KK classes meet from 1:00 to 3:00 P.M.

Kindergarten Enrichment Courses (#106-126) offer challenging and exciting experiences related to specific topics. Tuition for these courses is \$65 for 1¼ hour courses; sessions, times, buildings, rooms, and instructors are included in the course descriptions (see Schedule of Classes, which follows).

**SUMMER SCHOLARS RESIDENTIAL PROGRAM:** The Summer Scholars Residential Program is a one-week program for academically talented students completing the seventh and eighth grades. Students who qualify for the Academic Enrichment Program or for a parish gifted program are automatically eligible for this program; others may qualify on the basis of academic achievement tests taken at school. Participants live in UL Lafayette dormitories and are transported daily to the campus of Ascension Day School for full-day classes. All students schedule a Leadership course and two or three other classes selected from a variety of academic and arts options. There will be two one week sessions offered this summer: Session I: June 7-12; Session II: June 14-19. Scholarships are available for families who qualify on the basis of need. **UL LAFAYETTE EARLY ADMISSIONS PROGRAMS:** High-achieving students completing the 11<sup>th</sup> grade may qualify to earn college credit through the Early Admissions Programs. For further information on the Summer or Concurrent Early Admissions Program, contact a school counselor or the University Honors Program (337-482-6700).

**PROJECT CHALLENGE, COURSE #(NOT BEING OFFERED IN 2009):** In connection with our teacher training programs in education of the gifted, we sometimes offer a special summer segment called PROJECT CHALLENGE. CHALLENGE classes are taught by graduate teachers who are completing their credentials in education of the gifted and are eager to try new ideas and to develop the creative and intellectual potential of their students. An additional benefit of CHALLENGE is its low cost--\$25 per course for 22.5 hours of instruction. . **PLEASE NOTE: CHALLENGE tuition is refundable only if the class is full and the vacancy can be filled.**
