To be admitted to a College of Education certification minor program at the University of Louisiana at Lafayette, a candidate must present evidence of having fulfilled each of the following requirements:

- Major:** Upper Division major in either the College of Liberal Arts or the College of Sciences with emphasis on critical-need teaching areas for secondary grades 6 - 12
- GPA:** Adjusted grade point average of at least a 2.5
- Praxis Exam:** Passing scores on all 3 sections of the **Praxis Pre-Professional Skills Test**
Reading Writing Math
or **ACT Waiver** (Composite of 22 or higher) or SAT Waiver (1030 or higher)

COURSE REQUIREMENTS:

Professional Education Courses (24 credits) and Additional Praxis Exam Requirements:

- EDCI 450:** Classroom Management and Instructional Design for Secondary Teachers
- EDFL 456:** Classroom Assessment
- IREC 320:** Technology in the Classroom (This course will satisfy University/Regents core requirement)
- PSYC 312:** Adolescent Psychology (This course will satisfy University/Regents core requirement)
- READ 410:** Teaching Content Literacy in the Secondary/Middle School
- READ 425:** Teaching Reading in a Diverse Society
- SPED 391:** Foundations of Special Education
- EDCI 4xx:** Secondary School Subject Area Methods (Methods class in content area)

Praxis: Passing scores on the **Praxis II** content exam(s) prior to graduation. The **Principles of Learning and Teaching (PLT) Praxis exam (0524)** must be passed prior to enrolling in Student Teaching or an Internship.

EDCI 485/487 Student Teaching/Internship for Certification Candidates I and II (3 credits - Fall & Spring).

NOTE: No final grade below “C” is accepted for any professional education or specialized academic education course required for certification. Any course substitutions must be approved by the Dean’s Office, College of Education.
